## Juliana Warde Scores a Silver SCAD Summer Seminars Scholarship



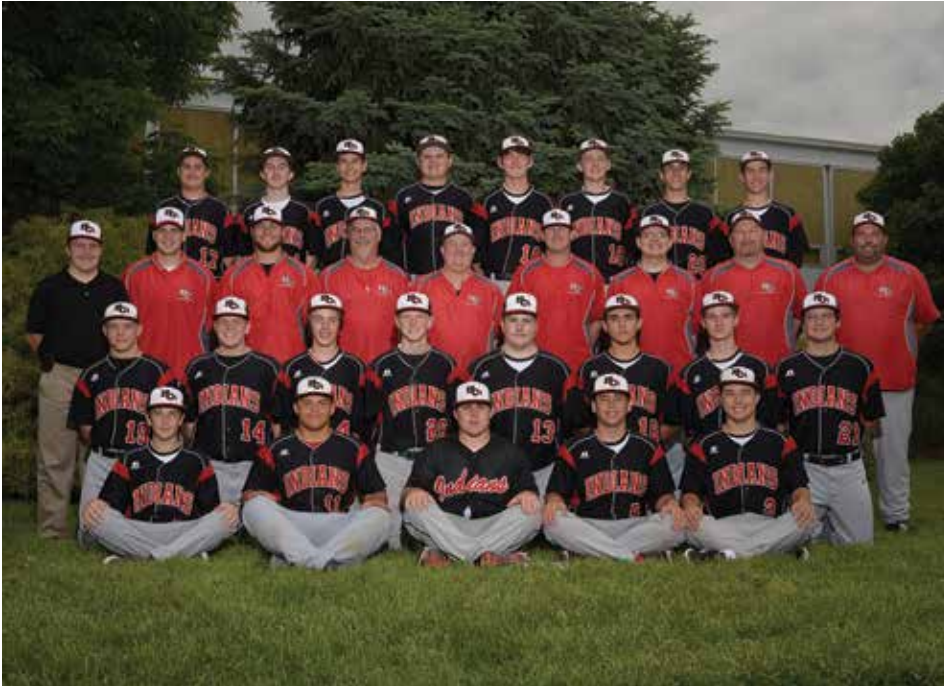

The Holy Cross Baseball season came to an end when it was knocked out of the 35th District Tournament by the Covington Catholic Colonels 2-1 in 8 innings. The Indians tied the game in the top half of the 7th and had the bases loaded with one out but could not push the go-ahead run across the plate.

The Indians finished the year with a 12-21 record. **Joey Yancey** led the team in hitting with a .370 batting average. Yancey was also selected to the NKAC All Conference team. **Mike Wilson** was the team's leading pitcher with a 3-2 record. **Wilson** pitched 7 strong innings of 1 run, 4 hit baseball vs. Covington Catholic in the District Tournament.

## BLAKE TIBERI IS 3RD ROUND PICK OF THE NEW YORK METS



**Blake Tiberi** '13 was selected by the New York Mets in the 3rd round of the Major League Baseball Draft. Tiberi was the 100th player picked in this year's draft.

After graduating from Holy Cross, Blake received a baseball scholarship to play for the University of Louisville. During this, his red shirt sophomore season, Blake started every game (currently 62) at 3rd base. He hit .331, slammed 9 home runs, and drove in 48 RBIs. Defensively, he was outstanding committing only 4 errors.

During his college summers, Blake played baseball in the New England Collegiate Summer League and in the prestigious Cape Cod League. It was in these summer leagues that Blake's stock began to rise as his all around play began to stand out against some top collegiate players in the nation.

Blake's playing career at Holy Cross was also something special. He became the 16th member of the Kentucky 200 Hit Club. His career batting ave. is over .500. Blake scored 170 career runs and banded out 60 career doubles. Following his senior season, Blake was named 1st Team All-State and the Player of the Year in the 9th Region.

Currently, Blake and the Louisville Cardinals are Champions of the Atlantic Division of the ACC, ranked 2nd nationally behind the Miami Hurricanes. The Cardinals lost their bid to play in the College World Series after a heart breaking loss in the Super Region to University of California-Santa Barbara.

Holy Cross is proud of Blake Tiberi and wishes him the best of luck as he begins his major league baseball career as a New York Met.

# MADYSON MORAN REFLECTS ON HER SOFTBALL JOURNEY FROM HC TO JAMES MADISON



**Madyson Moran**, a 2013 Holy Cross High School graduate and junior softball player at James Madison University, was one of the Dukes' top performers during the NCAA Division I Super Regionals May 27-28. JMU hosted Louisiana State in a best-of-three series during the "Sweet 16" of Division I softball, with the eight winners advancing to the College World Series.

After winning game one May 27 on a walk off hit in the bottom of the seventh, the Dukes dropped two games the next day, 2-0 and 3-2. In game three, JMU left the bases loaded in the bottom of the seventh.

Both games were aired live on the ESPN networks in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at JMU's Veterans Memorial Park.

"That was awesome," Moran said. "Throughout the year, we do a lot of community service to bring those fans out to our home field. I can't explain how awesome that was. You can't put it into words."

Moran, playing second base and hitting either sixth or seventh in the order, had a hit in each game against LSU and scored a run in game three.

"I think it was a great Super Regional," she said. "We lost to a tough team but at the end of the day we did the best we could. We just fell a little bit short."

She was first team all-conference in the Colonial Athletic Association and later first team all-region for JMU, located in Harrisonburg in northern Virginia.

Moran started all but one game this season. She hit .336 to rank third on the team. She hit five home runs and drove in 30 runs, ranking third on the team in RBIs. Moran also stole six bases.

She had a season high three hits in the regional tourney against North Carolina, including a home run. She had four RBIs against Towson this season.

"This year was a better year than I've had," she said. "It came down to what I was going to put forth for the team. I played second and did the best I could for the team."

On defense, Moran only committed two errors all season despite moving to second base. She had started at third her previous two seasons.

Overall, JMU allowed two runs or fewer in its first seven postseason games.

JMU allowed only 72 runs all year with two standout pitchers during a 50-6 season. JMU was ranked seventh in the national polls entering the LSU series.

"As a team, our success was pitching and defense," Moran said. "We had two defensive All-Americans and our defense carried us through the season. You got to stop the runs before you can score the runs."

Moran, a sports and recreation management major, left Holy Cross as the all-time school leader in most offensive categories. She hit .720 as a senior with 12 home runs and 65 runs scored.

She loves the chemistry of her team and hopes to make another run at the College World Series next year.

"When I was recruited, the coach told me he would give us a chance at the World Series," she said. "It didn't seem real until it happened. We came close. It was awesome. I'm lucky enough to be a junior and have one more year."

The track team had a very successful year in qualifying ten for the state track meet which began on May 29th at the University of Kentucky outdoor track facility. # Remember When

**P**at Morrissey grew up in West Covington. She attended Holy Cross High School for four years and graduated in 1963. For most rock and roll music lovers of the '60s the name Pat Morrissey probably doesn't ring a bell. How about the name Patti Valentine? Yes, that Patti Valentine of the duet "The 2 of Clubs." Whenever their songs are played on the local radio stations, the disc jockeys always refer to our fellow alumna by her married name.

Pat's partner was Linda Edmonson from Cincinnati. They met while working at Pat's first paying job, a night spot called Guys & Dolls in Cold Spring. Their voices "blended together very well" and they became a team. Linda's husband, Carl, headed up the house band at Guys & Dolls at the time.

I remember seeing them perform on a local TV station when I was a kid and, if I'm not mistaken, early on they were trying to come up with a name for themselves. One night after a show, they were leaving their venue when one of them slid on a card that turned out to be the 2 of clubs!

According to spectropop.com, Linda's husband had connections with the local Fraternity record label and after Pat's brother, Dennis '69, suggested they record a song on the B-side of a Petula Clark record called "Heart," their singing careers took off. "Heart" reached the top 10 while hovering just outside Billboard's Hot 100 in October of 1966. Their next release was an even bigger hit. The song, "Walk Tall (Like a Man)" entered the Cashbox chart in Christmas week, eventually peaking at #75 during a nine week run, and at #92 on Billboard.

In 1967, they released three more singles at RCA studios in Nashville. Along with Linda's B-side creation, the duo planned an album together. Unfortunately, Linda and her husband split up, eventually divorced and according to Pat, "The 2 of Clubs" became history.

Pat continued to sing alone for a few years until she got married. Her husband's job moved them out of state and she's never moved back.

She and Linda are still good friends and get together every once in a great while whenever possible. To this day, I still enjoy hearing their songs on the radio.

## BILL GOLLER AND CLAY EIFERT RETIRE

On Saturday May 21st, friends, alumni, teachers, staff and students gathered with good wishes for two Holy Cross High School legends, Bill Goller and Clay Eifert. Both men are retiring after dedicating a major part of their lives to the school.



In a graduation speech in the 1990s, Bill Goller told the seniors that he hoped that at some point they would all receive the “gift of finding something in life for which you have a passion.” There is no doubt that Bill himself received such a gift, and Holy Cross High School has benefited immeasurably from his passionate devotion to its students in almost half a century of tireless effort. He has served Holy Cross as teacher, sports coach, academic team coach, assistant principal, Spanish Club moderator, academic counselor, senior class sponsor, student council moderator, fundraiser, and principal. Almost halfway through his tenure at Holy Cross, Bill also guided the school through one of the most serious crisis in its history, leading it back from the brink of disaster to a state of increasing academic prosperity and financial stability.

National Catholic Educational Association named Bill the National Secondary Educator of the Year. They were only acknowledging what the Holy Cross High School community has always known. No one has been more integral to the uniqueness and success of this school than Bill Goller. Thank you for all that you have done for those who have walked through the front doors of this “old building” on Church Street.

Many people have come through the doors of Holy Cross, but seldom does a monument whose entire life encapsulates the spirit of the school arrive. Clay Eifert is that man. His affiliation with Holy Cross started in second grade and continued through high school where he was an excellent student and athlete. After attending Thomas More College on an academic scholarship, Clay came back to Holy Cross as a math teacher and baseball coach. Over the next 31 years, he taught computer science, accounting, and all levels of math, although he always held a special place in his heart for the Academic Enhancement students and any other kid who struggled in math. He never wavered in his commitment to give every student a chance to succeed. His occasional famous tirades were actually just another product of his intense concern for the students’ welfare, and the students themselves understood this. The players he coached had a similar insight. Besides coaching varsity baseball, he served as an assistant at various times of both girls’ and boys’ basketball, then took over the varsity boys’ position in 1993.

After serving as assistant principal for several years, Clay took over Holy Cross leadership in summer 2001. Over the next eleven years, he put his stamp on the school in countless ways. One of his main goals was to expand the school’s financial endowment to help those who could not afford a Catholic education. He immediately established an actual development department. Even with the new responsibilities, he would be the only principal throughout the entire diocese that taught while serving as principal. Unfortunately, due to worsening health problems, Clay had to step down as principal and is entering into retirement.

Clay’s love of Holy Cross and his dedication to it and its’ students will always be evident in how he has grown the school in his time as principal. We are sad to see Clay leave but know we will always be in his heart just as he will be in ours.
